Explorations of virtue ethics and the ethics of care have added considerable richness to social workers' understanding of ethical decisions. It is not enough to examine rules — such as those created by deontological and teleological theories — about what constitutes right and wrong action.

Virtue Ethics in Social Work

Remember, however, that the Code focuses on social workers' ethical obligations to clients, employers, society, colleagues, and the profession. It does not identify social workers' rights or freedoms. Standard 1.01 says that social workers' primary commitment is to their clients. This is one of Ella's key points.
